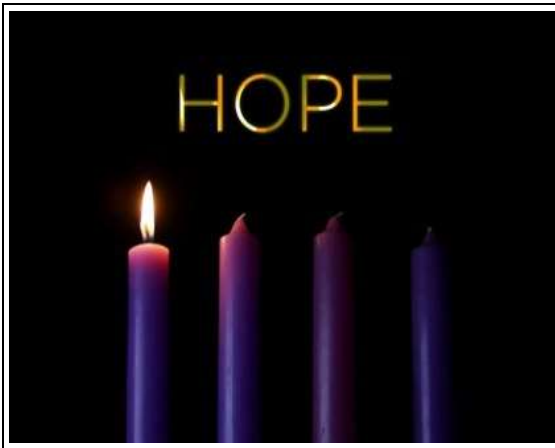

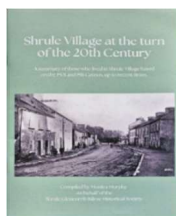

You will develop self-management skills and confidence to live well with your health conditions. You will also meet other people who live with long-term health conditions and learn from each other's experiences.

Prayerful preparation for Christmas 2024

WEDNESDAY 4 DECEMBER 8.00PM

Very Rev. Martin Whelan

— Incarnation in the writings of John Moriarty —
 Mystic and philosopher John Moriarty was born in Co. Kerry in 1938. He lost his Catholic faith as a teenager, and after some years of lecturing in Canada, he returned to Ireland and worked as a gardener. He eventually returned to the Catholic faith but with an entirely fresh vision of the tradition, drawing on the Rhineland mystics, Carmelite spirituality, ecology, and world mythology.

Fr Martin Whelan is parish priest of Moycullen. Having studied physics, philosophy and theology, Martin has an interest in the relationship between faith and science, which is a major theme in the writings of John Moriarty.

Br Ronan Sharpley OFM

Br Ronan is a native of Co. Leitrim. Having spent 4 years as a student in NUI Galway studying civil engineering in the noughties, he now finds himself back 15 years later as a Franciscan friar, this time ministering to the students and other young people of Galway. Br Ronan will speak about how this journey unfolded for him, from Galway to El Salvador as a lay missionary and then back to Galway, and what drew him to both youth ministry and the Franciscan Friars.
